Introduction

Today's e-books are electronic versions of their paper forebears. As reader software becomes more sophisticated and human readers and authors become more comfortable with e-book technology, e-books will become more interactive.

This document accompanies a prototype of an interactive e-book version of the *Harry Potter* series and describes how users would interact with it. The prototype shows how readers might access supplemental information that could be built into the e-book or linked to in related books.

The *Harry Potter* example illustrates not just one interactive e-book but also a platform that could support many similar books. Interactive e-book platforms will emerge. Platform battles are won by attracting developers, which means building scale, which means opening up a lead early.

Overview Model

The diagram at right shows preliminary thinking for creating a consistent and flexible UI structure for developing interactive e-book features on a touch screen Kindle. These features can also work on Kindles with 5-way selectors.

The horizontal (blue) rows represent different features. The vertical (pink) columns represent the UI elements. Moving from left to right, the user is presented with more information.

If the term is included in related book


e.g., Characters show Relations
Timelines show Context
Maps show Location

If the term is included within the book's supplimentary information

e.g., Glossary show Definition

If the term is not included in related books or in the book's supplimentary information

e.g., Common words *show* Dictionary definition



Imagine being able to tap any character name in a book and use an interactive "family tree." The interactive cast of characters not only includes details about the selected character, but also the character's relationship to other characters, what events the character was involved in, when those happened, and be able to jump directly to other places where the character appears.






Full-Screen Feature Character One

The user tapped the Character button from the character pop-over and is presented with a full-screen, interactive feature.




Full-Screen Feature Dismiss

The user tapped outside the details pop-over to enable panning, zooming, and tapping of other characters.




Full-Screen Feature Pan

The user panned around the cast of characters full-screen feature.




Full-Screen Feature Character Two

The user tapped a thumbnail image from the cast of characters full-screen feature.




Full-Screen Feature Dismiss

The user tapped outside the details pop-over to enable panning, zooming, and tapping of other characters.




Full-Screen Feature Zoom Out

The user pinched two fingers together to shrink the page and see more of the cast of characters.




Full-Screen Feature List View

The user tapped the list view option from the tool bar at the top of the screen.




Full-Screen Feature Scroll



Event Pop-Over


The user tapped the name of an event and the event pop-over appears displaying the event name and a short description.

The user can view the entire timeline and has access to the existing menu of options such as highlighting, notes, translation, dictionary, Wikipedia, and report errors.




Full-Screen Feature **Event One**

The user tapped the Timeline button from the event pop-over and is presented with a full-screen, interactive feature.




Full-Screen Feature Dismiss

The user tapped outside the details pop-over to enable panning and tapping of timeline items.




Full-Screen Feature Pan

The user panned around the timeline full-screen feature




Full-Screen Feature Pan



Location Pop-Over


The user tapped the name of a location and the location pop-over appears displaying the location name and a small map preview.

The user can view the entire map and has access to the existing menu of options such as highlighting, notes, translation, dictionary, Wikipedia, and report errors.




Full-Screen Feature Details

The user tapped the Map button from the location pop-over and is presented with a full-screen, interactive feature.




Full-Screen Feature Dismiss




The user tapped the name of a dragon and the dragon pop-over appears displaying an image, name, basic stats, and a short description of the dragon.
