Introduction

Readers often want to know about other books related to ones they are reading or own. Providing this information creates a sales opportunity.

It is related to (but also different from) the "Customers Who Bought This Item Also Bought" (CWBTIAB) collaborative-filtering feature of the Amazon store.

Most books are associated with meta-data that could link them to other books, for example:

- Title: other books in the same series
- Author: other books written by the same person
- Publisher: other books in the same family
- Subject: other books on the same topic or in the same genre
- Cover illustrator or book designer:
 other books in which the same person was involved
 (e.g., covers by Chip Kidd or typography by Bradbury Thompson)
- Other versions: earlier or later editions, translations into other media (e.g., the film version or the audio version)
- Awards: other books that won a similar award
- Lists: other books in the same list (e.g., Justice Breyer: The 10 books that shaped my intellectual development, Oprah recommends.... or Aunt Sally's favorite cook books)
- In the case of fiction, non-fiction books about the period or subject
- In the case of non-fiction, novels, stories, or movies touching on the subject

Access from the Table of Contents: Grid View

This section shows how users could access related content from the table of contents in a book. The content is presented to the user as a visual grid.

Overview Model

The diagram at right shows the thinking behind one possible UI structure for revealing related books and content to users. Related content is displayed in a grid.

The viewable area—or screen—is represented by the blue rectangle.


Sections are stacked on top of each other vertically.
Users swipe up and down to browse the related content (vertical orange arrow).

Items within sections are placed side by side horizontally. If there are more than three items within a section, then the items overflow to the right. Users swipe left and right to browse within a section (horizontal orange arrow).






New Home screen design based on earlier explorations.

Related Books and Content link added to the end of the table of contents.


6.3 Related Content Top



Related Books and Content opens as a fullscreen view. The Status Bar displays the book name to keep context for the user. Tapping the close X returns to the user to the table of contents.


Expanding a Section and go to Store

The tapped section opens as a fullscreen view. Tapping the back button returns the user to the related contents view.




Tapping any book cover brings the user to the Kindle Store.





This section shows how users could access related content from the end of the book. The content is presented to the user as a text list.



11.1 Book End


The user has read to the last page of their book.

The user taps the right side of the screen (or swipes left) to page forward. Paging forward reveals the Chrome with a button for Related Books. Tapping the Rate and Tweet buttons open separate dialog windows.

11.3 Related Content Top




Related Books and Content opens as a fullscreen view. Tapping the close X returns to the user to the end of the book.

Access from a New Interface: Fish-Eye Browser

This section shows how users could access related content from a new interface not used elsewhere in the Kindle. The content is presented to the user as a web of related content which encourages exploration. The web has a focusing mechanism applied to it—similar to a fish-eye lens—which prevents the user from being overwhelmed by the amount of possibilities.





13.3 Links Filtered




Users can use the slider at the bottom of the screen to filter the number of connections shown.





16.1 Video Playback



The video begins playing in widescreen orientation.


16.2 In-Video Purchase



The user taps an items on screen. The video automatically pauses and displays a pop-up which enables the user to purchase directly from within the video playback.

The user can select size and color from the pulldown menus, then tap the \$235.00 Buy button to purchase the item. A brief, inline process indicator followed by a confirmation would appear, the pop-up would close, and the video would resume playback right where the user left off.

16.3 In-Video Store




The user taps the Shop from Kindle Store link at the bottom of the In-Video Purchase pop-up. Tapping the back button would resume playback right where the user left off.



Existing Related Books: Overview Map


All dots represent a click on the center of the 5-way. Other controls are noted as exceptions.








Home to Book End to Store


